Students with disabilities ages 14-22 enrolled in a recognized education program.

Must have documentation of a disability.

Students don't have to be a Vocational Rehabilitation client.

Services are provided by <u>the</u>

Rehabilitative Services (DARS)

Talk to the IEP team or call your <u>local</u> DARS office to ask for Pre-ETS.

Job Exploration Counseling

Work-Based Learning Experiences

Counseling on Education & Training Opportunities

Workplace Readiness Training

Instruction in Self-Advocacy

Supports transition planning during high school/college.

Connects students with community providers and employers.

Helps with problem-solving and decision-making skills.

Teaches social and independent living skills.

Helps students decide what they are good at, where they need help, and what they would like to do after high school.

Learn about and explore different jobs on job sites.

Go on campus tours.

Learn skills that help students get and keep a job.

Learn about employer expectations.

Learn about financial aid.

Learn how to ask for accommodations.

Identify career pathways.

Go on interviews.

Pre-ETS is the first step in the continuum of DARS transition services. Pre-ETS activities are exploratory; VR services are more focused.

Pre-ETS and VR can be received at the same time. VR services can support eligible students while they receive Pre-FTS.

Pre-ETS services are provided in coordination with school based services.

Individuals must apply and be found eligible for VR services. A VR application is not required for Pre-ETS.

Pre-ETS focuses on finding out and exploring employment interests.

VR Services prepare the person to reach a specific job goal.
